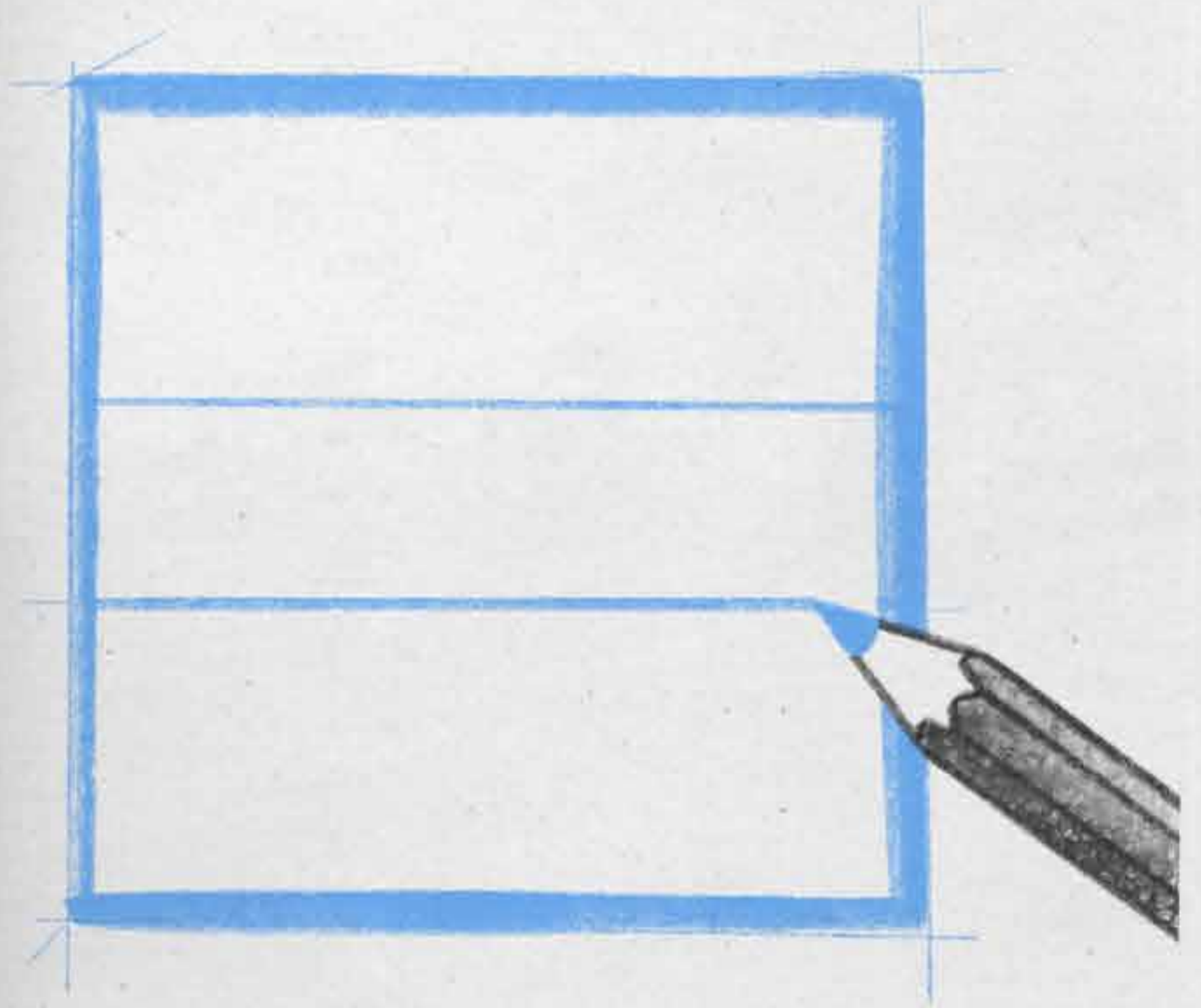




I DON'T NEED TO FOLLOW

THAT'S ONLY LOGICAL.



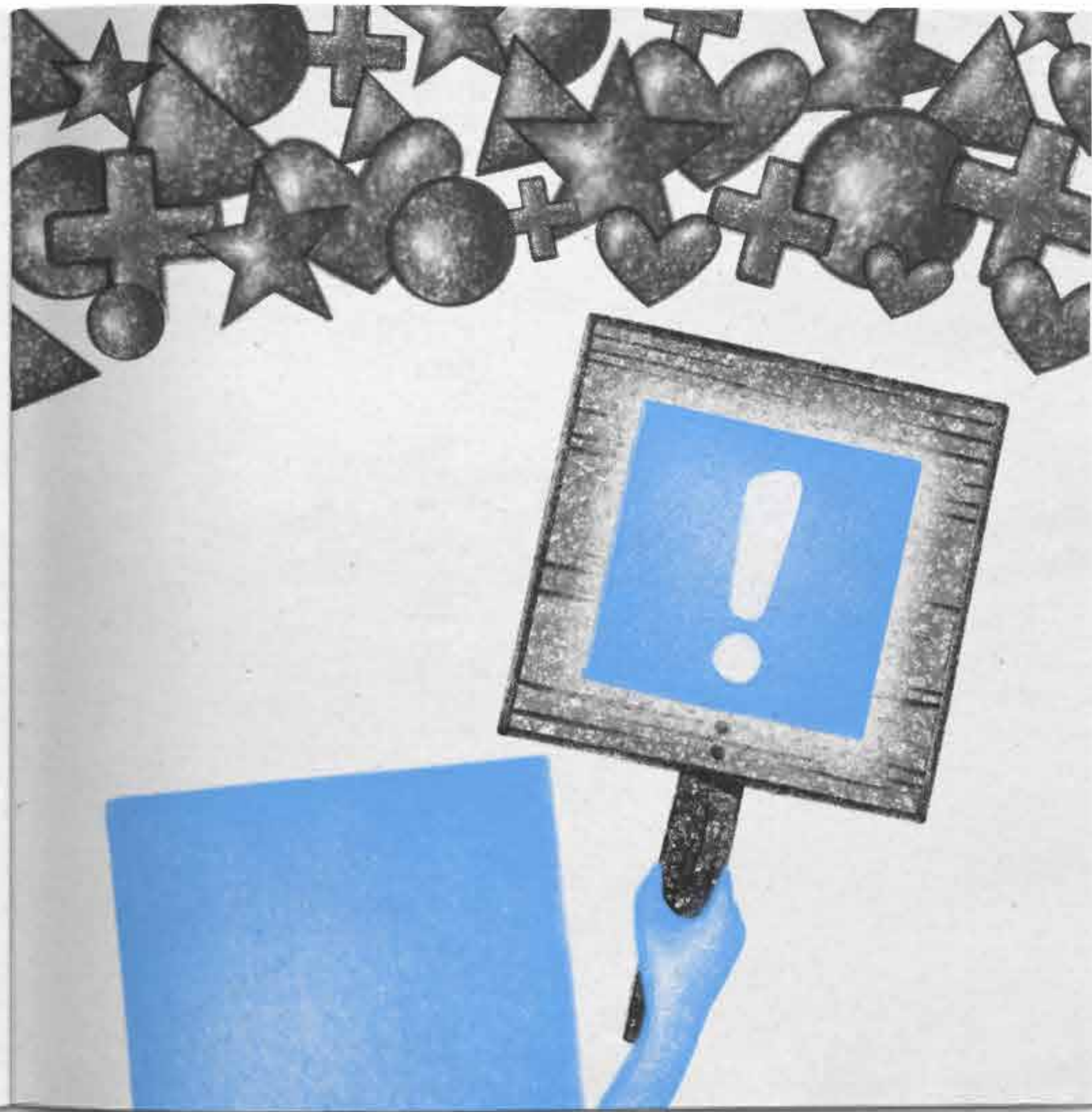
WHEN EVERYTHING IS

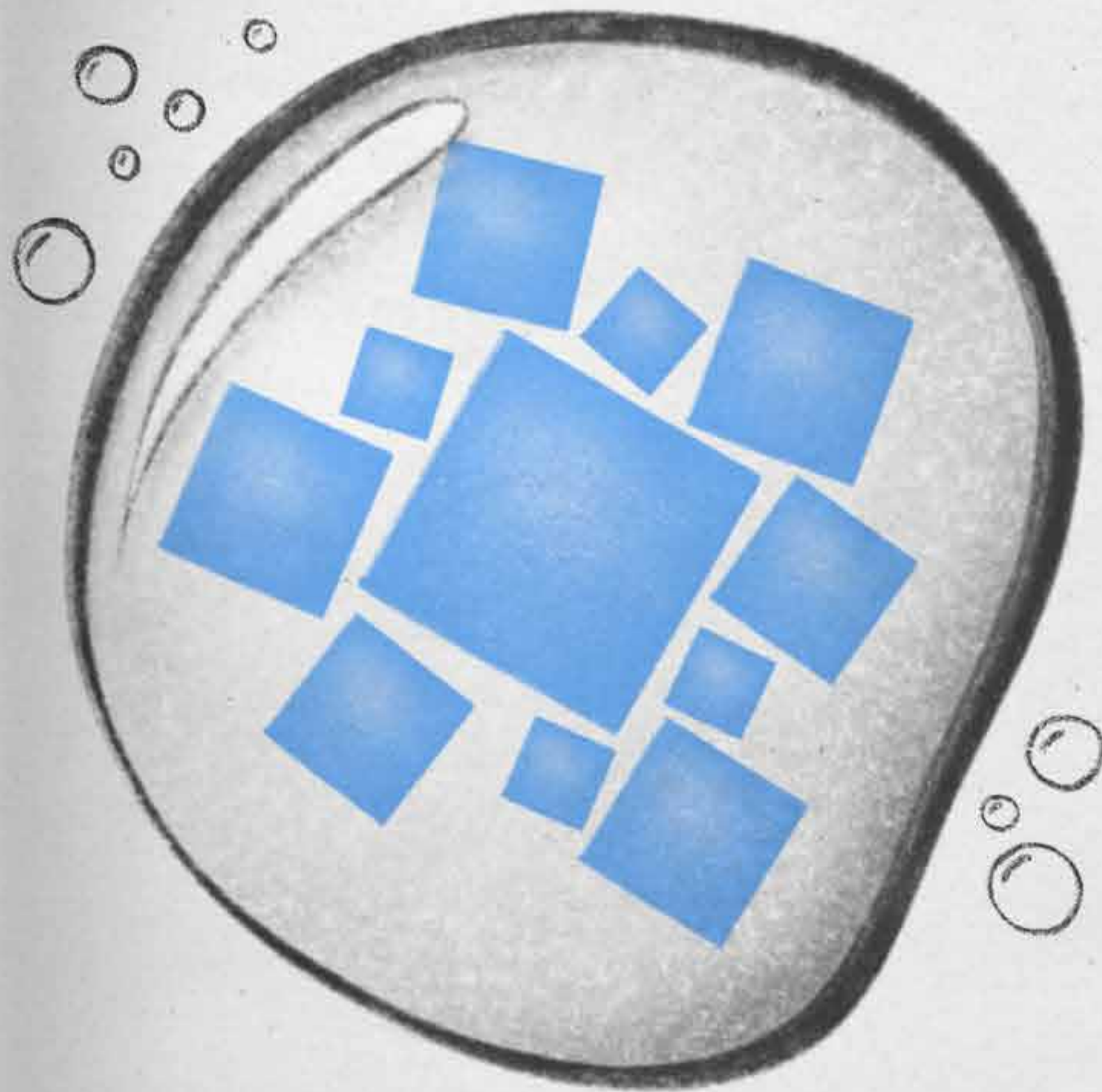

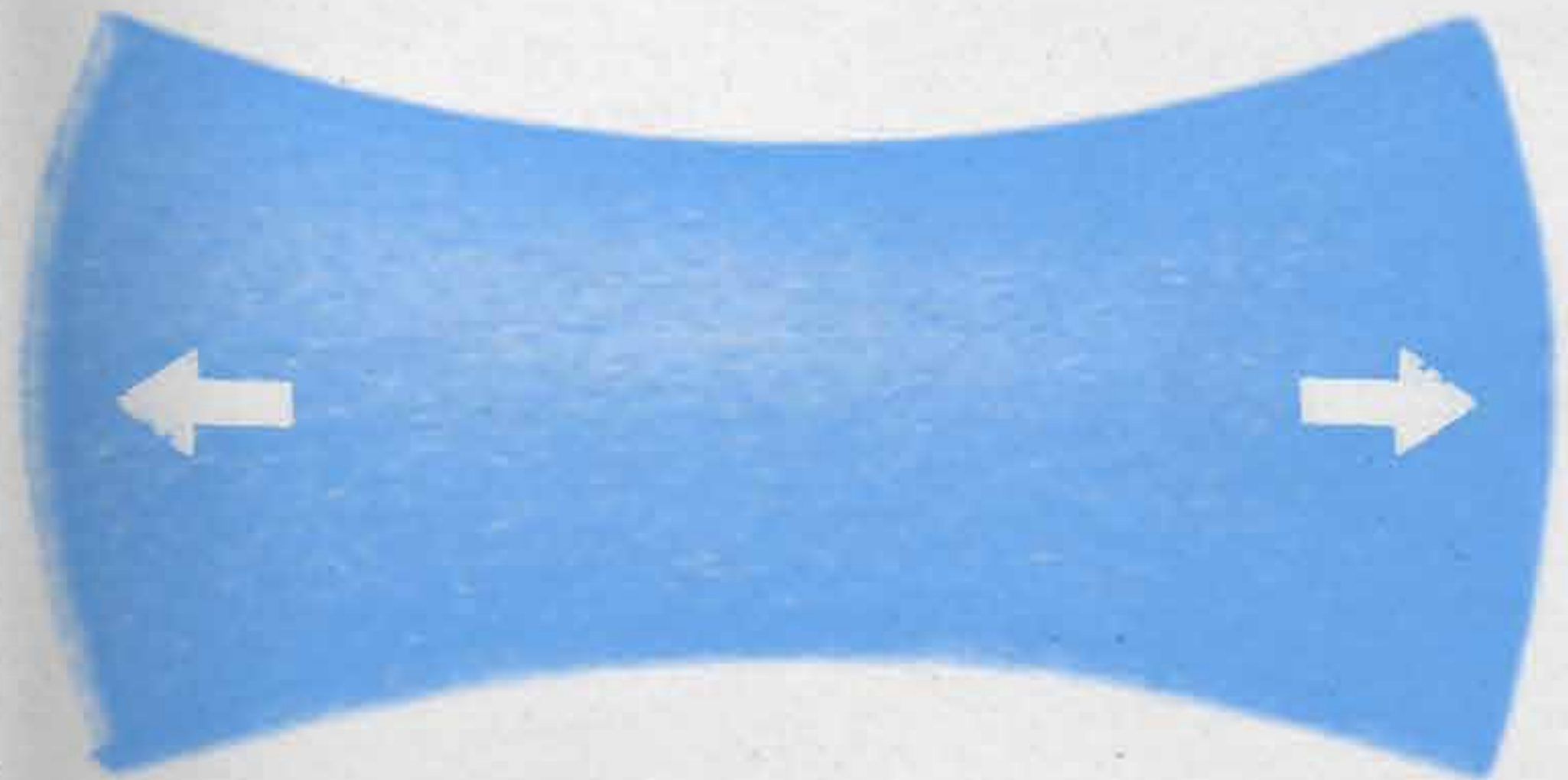

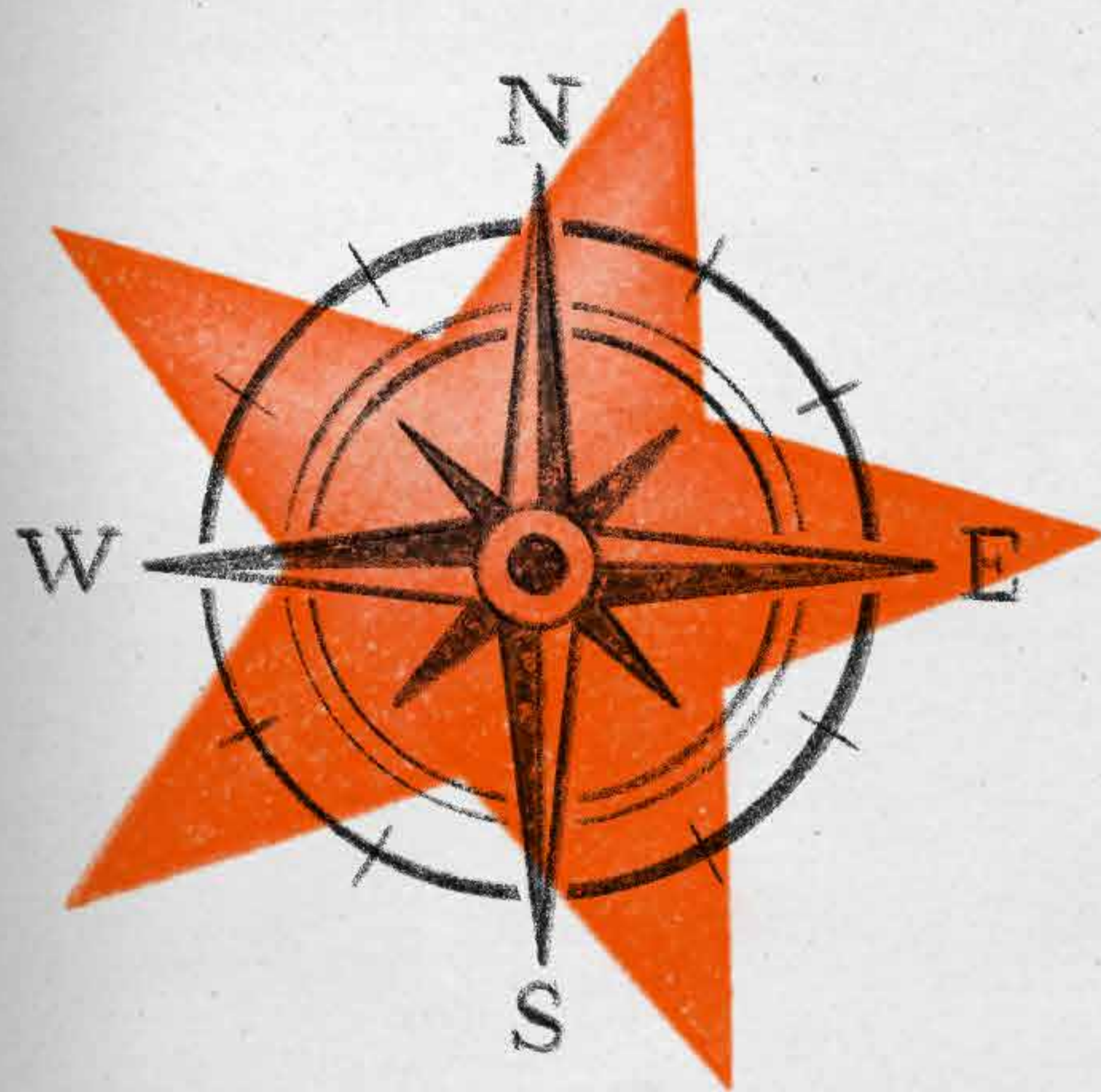


...FROM A FLIPPED PERSPECTIVE?
